## CLIM Fall 2025 Update

We hope this finds all our friends in good health and good spirits as we bid farewell to summer and usher in the fall season.

We're excited to share that we've been able to fund several long-awaited projects. The teachers' building, which was demolished during flooding earlier this year, will now be rebuilt—and solar power will be installed. Progress takes time there, but it's a great encouragement to those working in our compound to see things moving forward. We've also been able to continue to send food Aid into the Twic area for refugees fleeing the fighting in the North. No large aid organizations are operating there, and the church is stepping up to



reach out to the suffering refugees fighting in the north, arriving in the region. There is currently no safe place for Christians in the north. Many are being massacred, and homes and churches are being burned.



Things remain unstable in the South as well. Recently, the Ambassador to the US from South Sudan, Ambassador Dickens, and the Minister of Foreign Affairs from South Sudan, the Honorable Semaya

Kumba met on Capital Hill with our lawmakers in hopes of restoring relations and trust with our government. Corruption in the South Sudanese government has been an issue since its inception. Both men are committed Christians and hope to be agents of change. They are aware of the role the church here played in South Sudan's independence in 2011, and they hope to reestablish those ties and re-engage the church in partnership and prayer. They know that only God

can restore South Sudan. Ambassador Dickens and Minister Kumba invited members of the faith community who were involved in the struggle for independence and who continue to support South Sudan through advocacy, ministry, and aid. It was a privilege to be part of the meeting and to hear the hopes and plans of these two fine men. Please continue to pray for the government of South Sudan.



Longar is currently in Juba and is having difficulty securing employment. He had high hopes of working at the airport after studying aviation for two years in Kenya, but so far, it hasn't worked out. Prayers for Longar are deeply appreciated.

We also hope to expand the clinic in the near future. The need is great, and our resources are limited. We need more equipment and medicine, and we're hoping to install solar power there as well. We are the only clinic in the entire region. During malaria season, we provide children with antimalarial drugs prophylactically, which has helped keep cases to a minimum.
